Guadalajara is celebrating!!!, As we will be co-hosting the 11th edition of the Gay Games in 2023.

Near the end of LGBT Pride Month, this last June 28th, a press conference was held, where the governor of Jalisco and his Tourism, Sports, and Culture Secretaries announced to local and national media the Gay Games Guadalajara 2023. The Games of Diversity, Inclusion, Union, and Fraternity.

One of the highlights of the governor's speech: "it is a job that should be assumed as a priority for everyone, because this city (Guadalajara), its history, culture, and its capability to think about the future needs to be permanently accompanied by respect and tolerance."

Also, the Sports Director of Jalisco said that a strategy will be implemented, including retrofitting the spaces that were built for the Pan-American Games, so the quality of each one of them is guaranteed according to each discipline's rules and requirements.

In terms of public policy and human rights, Jalisco is one of the few Mexican States that has made great progress in recognizing our community, because same-sex marriage has been approved, as well as the same-sex adoption, the recognition of de Trans Childhood Identities rights, and the abolition of conversion therapies.

Guadalajara is getting ready with a first class quality cultural and touristic offer, to the athletes and their companions nine days of sport and artistic

experiences in an atmosphere of global celebration.

At the same time, an important alliance with Puerto Vallarta and Tequila is taking place, to hold tours before and after the Gay Games, so our "amigos" leave with a very Mexican lifetime experience!

Guadalajara is ready to be among the best Gay Games hosts ever, because everyone here is and it will always be welcome!



40-DAY "PASSING THE TORCH" CAMPAIGN TO CELEBRATE 40TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE GAYGAMES







With the 40th anniversary of the first Gay Games fast approaching, the Federation of Gay Games (FGG) is launching a 40-day series of online posts chronicling its history, told by those who have led the global LGBTQ+ sports and culture movement since its inception. Entitled "Passing The Torch," this series of essays will be accompanied by iconic images from the FGG digital archives.

"I was part of the first out lesbian football team in Europe in the mid-1980s, participated in several Gay Games beginning in 1994, and have served on the administrative side for nearly two decades" stated current FGG Co-President Joanie Evans of London UK. "It really is extraordinary to see how people's contributions overlap and are interwoven into the fabric of the Gay Games, and how so much of that history is relevant to our goals and our future." Evans is just one of nine current and former FGG Board Co-Presidents contributing editorial content to the project. Nearly half of the two dozen individuals contributing editorial content participated in the inaugural Gay Games in 1982, with several participating in all ten Gay Games. Also sharing their stories about the impact the Gay Games has made on their lives and communities are world record holders and sports administrators from around the world.

"Best of all, we even have previously unpublished comments made by Gay Games founder Tom Waddell, as well as a special tribute by his daughter, Jessica Waddell-Lewinstein Kopp," added FGG Archivist and former Officer of Marketing Doug Litwin (San Francisco, USA). Litwin has been curating this project for the past two years through the FGG Culture & Ceremonies Committee along with Honorary Life Member Shamey Cramer (Los Angeles, USA), a Gay Games pioneer and associate of Dr. Waddell; as well as representatives from the Gay Games 11 Host Organization.

The series will run from 28 July – one month before the 40th anniversary of the original Opening Ceremony at San Francisco's Kezar Stadium – and run through 5 September, the anniversary of the Gay Games I Closing Ceremony.

The 40th Anniversary of the first Gay Games will also be celebrated during Gay Games 11, being co- hosted in November 2023 in Hong Kong and Guadalajara, the first time the Gay Games will be held in Asia and Latin America. 1. Why do you volunteer for the Gay Games?

3. Tell us a bit about you – who you are, where you live, what you do when you are not volunteering for FGG

5. How much time do you have to dedicate to volunteering for FGG (Lots of people think they don't have the time)

I still keep an old-fashioned paper day planner, (in addition to an online calendar) as it better affords me the opportunity to see my days and appointments in a flat- out arrangement, versus an on-line calendar (which have been known to magically disappear) and therefore, I am able to easily manage my schedule, which works for my own personal time management system.
