Part of the NSCAA's mission is to bring awareness of gay and lesbian issues within the sport of soccer. Two specific LGBT sessions were held at the convention where Liecty was able to speak about the Gay Games.

Fair Day is the most anticipated and fun day of the whole Sydney Mardi Gras festival, and it is held in a park in Newtown which is right in the centre of the LGBT community. Despite the danger of rain (which held off as the day proceeded, getting very hot by the afternoon), the crowds just kept on coming. Over 70,000 + enjoyed a mass of stalls and special events.



Team Sydney with its new sponsor PAS coordinated the Sports Village with over 25 clubs represented including new ones. Kate Rowe and Norm Mitchell, the Team Sydney delegates to the FGG, looked after the Paris 2018 stall and answered questions throughout the day.



Many who have already registered came to say hello. The most popular questions were about running, soccer, aquatics, softball and cycling, but other clubs showed a keen interest in Paris. Michelle Ferris, an FGG ambassador and dual Olympian silver medallist was volunteering on the Women's Softball booth and deciding on which sport she will play in Paris.

Team Sydney will be very active organising uniforms for all participants in partnership with their new sponsor.

Nicolas Crozier, Consul General of France in Australia, dropped by to present the shield for the Tug of War winners, along with Jaime Fuller the Chairman of SKINS, also a sponsor of Team Sydney.
